## Energy Bills are Rising and support is available at Stirling Citizens Advice Bureau Ltd

From the 1st October Energy prices are increasing. It will affect around 15 million households on variable or default rates and prepayment meters. If this increase affects you then there is support available.

Ofgem has put in place a strong safety net to support consumers struggling to pay their bills. If you or your family are in vulnerable circumstances or in debt, there is help available for you and I urge you to contact your supplier to access it.

If you are on a pre-payment meter, protections include being able to ask your energy supplier for emergency credit.

If you are struggling to pay your bill, contact your energy supplier to explain what you can pay and when – they are bound by Ofgem rules to listen, if they do not listen you can contact Stirling CAB for support.

Low income households, especially pensioners, can get a £140 off their electricity bills under the Warm Home Discount

#### You are protected when energy firms collapse!

You will not be left without power if your supplier goes bust. Ofgem – as the independent energy regulator - will automatically switch you onto a new supplier so there will be no interruption to your supply of energy.


There are rules and regulations that all suppliers must follow. The price of energy will be increasing but they can offer support when required.


